You're at a restaurant called "Madison's Grill." We named the restaurant after the street we're on. The street was named after James Madison.

## So, who was James Madison?

James Madison served two terms as the fourth President of the United States (1809 - 1817).

Madison was born in Port Conway, Virginia, on March 16, 1751. He entered what is now Princeton University when he was 17 years old, studying government and history.



Madison helped write the Virginia Constitution, was a leader in the Virginia legislature, where he worked diligently for religious freedom, and was a member of the Continental Congress. During this time, Madison and Thomas Jefferson became close friends.

In 1787, Madison was the youngest member of the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Madison participated in editing the final draft of the US Constitution and is sometimes called "The Father of the Constitution."

President Thomas Jefferson appointed Madison Secretary of State in 1801.

During Madison's term as President, the "Star-Spangled Banner" was written (by Francis Scott Key), steamboats began to operate, gaslights were introduced and many new roads were built.

Madison retired to Montpelier, his home in Virginia, in 1817.

During retirement, he helped Jefferson found the University of Virginia, and worked against slavery. Madison died on June 28, 1836 - he was 85 years old.

## Don't forget Dolley!

On Sept. 15, 1794, Madison married Dorothea (Dolley) Payne Todd. Dolley was a widow with one surviving child. James Madison and Dolley never had children, but Dolley led the social life in Washington, D.C., for many years. She was famous for throwing parties and making people of all ages and backgrounds feel welcome. Dolley began the tradition of the annual Easter Egg hunt on the White House lawn. To this day she remains one of our best known and best loved first ladies. In 1999 she became the only First Lady to ever appear on US currency, when a commemorative dollar coin was minted in her honor.

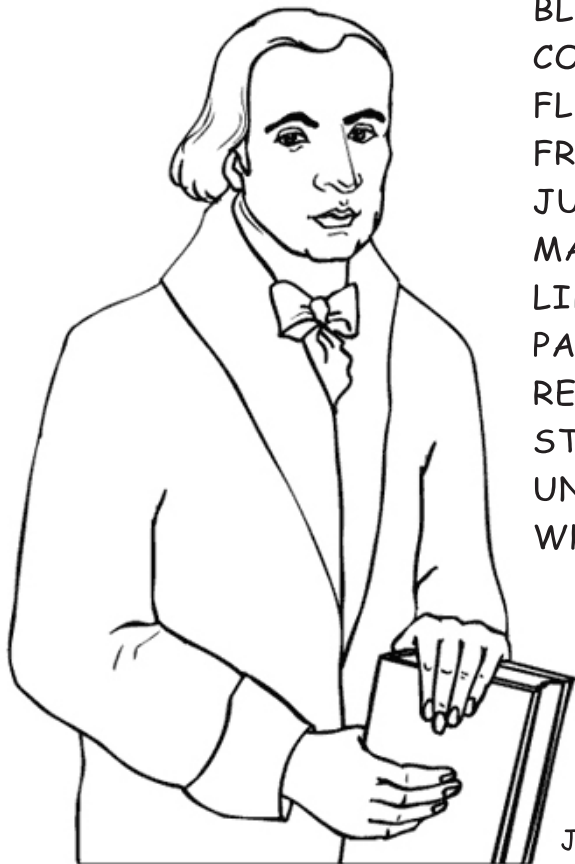
